

Daniel Ben-Simon is an [Israeli](#) journalist and politician, who served as a member of the [Knesset](#) for the [Labor Party](#) between 2009 and 2013. Daniel was born in [Meknes](#) in [Morocco](#) and made [aliyah](#) to Israel in 1969. He worked for [Davar](#) for over a decade and later for [Haaretz](#). He taught journalism at [Sapir College](#) and [Rupin College](#) and also wrote four books, and was involved in the making of documentary films based on two of his books. He is a recipient of the Sokolov Prize. Prior to the 2009 elections, he joined the Labor party and entered the Knesset. Daniel was elected chairman of Labor's Knesset faction and served in that position briefly. After the 2013, he did not return to the Knesset when Labor only won 15 seats. Daniel has a BA from the University of Haifa and an MSc in Journalism from Boston University.
